Viola and Live Processed Video (Max/MSP/Jitter)

Note:

Orlando, for viola and live processed video (Max/MSP/Jitter), loosely follows the narrative of Virginia Woolf's novel of the same name. The viola takes the part of Orlando, who begins life as a nobleman in the court of Queen Elizabeth I, moonlights as an ambassador in Turkey, and ends up as a housewife in the 1920s. Like the novel, the piece is divided into several sections that provide "snapshots" of Orlando's life.

While *Orlando* is an entirely acoustic work, the amplitude of the viola is mapped to the brightness of the images presented in the video component. The result is something akin to an auditory and visual séance, with Orlando flickering to life in front of the audience.

The displayed high-resolution images, which originally appeared in Woolf's novel as black and white reproductions, were generously provided by Lord Sackville and the National Trust of England.

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*The pedal controlling the Max/MSP/Jitter patch should be pressed exactly once just before each tempo marking.
